FUR

Our motto is "Wildlife needs your help". The SSWA has proudly worked with Saskatchewan Environment and other organizations to assist in the understanding of wildlife habitats, populations, herd structures and other species specific issues.

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) : CWD is present in mule deer, white-tailed deer, elk, moose and caribou. CWD is on the rise, in some areas it has been detected in approximately 75per cent of farmland wildlife management zones in the province.

Chronic wasting disease is an infectious protein called a prion. It is dropped or spread to the soil through feces, urine and saliva. The prion can be brought up through the photosynthesis activity into a plant, and then it's a very difficult disease to try to control.

SSWA and the Ministry of Environment are encouraging all hunters to have their game tested for chronic wasting disease anywhere in Saskatchewan they harvest an animal.

Get your heads tested by dropping them off at ministry offices or specified drop off locations. These drop off locations and information on how to generate a CWD tracking tag online and how to submit the labelled samples can be found at Saskatchewan.ca/cwd and cwdsk.ca

There is no cost for the testing and samples are being accepted from any Wildlife Management Zone (WMZ) in the province.

Saskatchewan Ministry of health recommends that hunters NOT eat CWD contaminated animal that has been classified as positive, get your heads tested.

It is recommended that hunters avoid the use of mineral licks, baiting and feeding which congregate the animals, increasing the spread of the infection Another current issue is the Hunter Harvest Survey. Due to low response rates in the past, mandatory hunter harvest surveys are being proposed for the future. These surveys are critical in helping evaluate game population. Wildlife biologists rely on this information to better understand how game populations are responding to current management strategies.

Since hunting laws are subject to change on a yearly basis, it's important for all hunters to keep track of bag limits, season dates, and important wildlife management issues. This information is in the Saskatchewan hunting and

trapping guide issued with your licence at no charge or online. Remember poachers and polluters can have a very negative affect on wildlife and habitat, so call the TIP service if you suspect any fishing, wildlife or environmental resource violations at 1-800-667-7561 24-hr, seven days a week. CANADIAN FIREARM SAFETY CERTIFICATION AND SASK HUNTER EDUCATION YOUTH CERTIFICATION.

THE MOOSE JAW FIREARM SAFETY/HUNTER EDUCATION INSTRUCTOR GROUP continues to provide classes enabling youth and adults to achieve the required certification to obtain a POSSESSION AND ACQUISITION LICENSE (PAL OR RPAL) and SASK HUNTER EDUCATION CERTIFICATION.

NOTE: * ONE MUST BE 18 YEARS OLD TO APPLY FOR A PAL.

Students younger than 18 minimum age 12 who pass the Cdn Firearm Safety course are given documentation to save until they are 18 which proves they passed the course.

The MJFAS/HED Instructor Group has recently modified their method of delivery of services. This is the format we now follow:

1. We teach the CFSC, review of the online SASK HUNTER ED COURSE, provide hands on Firearm instruction and administer the SHED comprehensive written and Practical Handling test, the CFSC Written and Practical Test on a Friday evening and Saturday am/pm . (8 hr CFSC plus SHED Review and Testing totalling around 11.5-12 hours)
2. We want our students to FIRST do their Sask Hunter Ed Online go www.saskhuntered.ca, click on online courses, register with your credit card, do the 12 chapters. When you have passed your 12 chapter on line course and printed off your report card you can register on our website for one of our two day courses. Google MJHuntered google sites. The website gives you directions how to do the Registration and payment for the 2 day course.

4. Course schedule is early Sept, Early Jan, and the weekend after Easter. Check out the MJHuntered website, the SSWA website, and the MJWF website for more info.

Range Rules

Revised July 2019

1- The range officer has final say on all things involving the range.

Range officer commands must always be followed.

2- No food, beverages, or smoking allowed in the shooting area. No alcohol or drugs will be permitted. If a person is suspected of being under the influence of any substance that would influence their actions or decisions, or put in danger the safety of others, that person will not be allowed to shoot and will be asked to leave. Any shooter that is deemed to be un-safe will be asked to cease fire and will be re-orientated at the discretion of the range officer. If the shooter continues unsafe behavior, they may be asked to leave.

3- If damages occur that are caused by negligence, it will be the shooters responsibility to pay for the repairs.

4- Hearing and Eye protection must be worn in the shooting area. No exceptions. Everyone has the right to call cease fire if they feel it is warranted.

The steps to a cease fire are as follows;

A- Firearms are unloaded, magazine removed.

B- Firearms are laid on the shooting mat on the table, Muzzles pointed in a safe direction down range, with the chamber facing up for visual inspection, if using a revolver, the cylinder must be left open.

C- All shooters step back from the firing line, behind the "cease-fire" line.

D- No Handling of the firearms until the range officer gives the all clear.

5- During a power failure and if the emergency backup lights fail. These procedures must be followed.

Do not panic

Remove your finger from the trigger immediately.

Do not move from fire line position.

Keep firearm pointed down range.

Do not try to disarm your firearm.

A range officer equipped with a flashlight will instruct each shooter on the firing line.

Shooters on the firing line will disarm their firearm with the assistance of the range officer.

6- It is the shooters responsibility for range clean up at the end of the shooting session. The range officer may designate one or more people for range clean up if necessary.

7- Holsters or speed rigs are not permitted on the range, only the standing shooting position is permitted; there is a shooting rest available for use.

8- All new shooters will go through an orientation night to be held Wednesday evenings this includes shooting one of our club guns to verify that the new shooter can safely handle a firearm. And to ensure a certain level of firearms proficiency and safe handling. All firearms and ammunition must be approved by the range officer. Guests are allowed but must buy a \$20.00 S.S.W.A membership to be covered by our insurance, if guests do NOT have a P.A.L they must be accompanied by someone with a P.A.L and must be under their direct supervision and within arm's reach during shooting, guests may only shoot for three sessions, then they must buy a full membership to continue shooting.

9- Firearms must always be pointed down range. The firearm must always be treated as if its loaded, follow acts and prove.

Assume every firearm is loaded

Control the muzzle direction at all times

Trigger finger must be kept off the trigger and out of the trigger guard

See that the firearm is unloaded

PROVE it safe.

Point the firearm in the safest available direction

Remove all ammunition

Observe the chamber

Verify the feeding path

Examine the bore each time you pick up a firearm

10- Our club guns may be used free of charge by range members. Members may supply their own FACTORY ammo. We do not allow re-loaded am- munition in our club guns due to warranty; you may also buy ammunition at the range. The firearms must be cleaned when done shooting, we have the following firearms available.

Smith and Wesson .22lr revolver.

Ruger MKIV .22lr Target.

Smith and Wesson .357 magnum (.38 special may also be fired).

Smith and Wesson M&P 2.0 in 9MM

11- Red light indicates that the range is active and the range door to the shooting line must remain closed, green light indicates that it is safe to enter the range, firearms must remain cased and locked until light is red.

12- Only one firearm and one magazine may be used at a time.

13- We do not allow center fire rifles, black powder (rifles or pistols) or shotguns. The only rifles permitted will be .22LR (no .17 HMR).

14- Ammunition allowed/not allowed

Copper plated/ copper jacketed and lead bullets are permitted.

No steel core surplus ammo.

Reloaded ammunition is allowed, however. The shooter will be held responsible for any damages or injuries that may occur.

Hollow points are not allowed. Except for .22lr

Ammunition being fired must not have a muzzle energy exceeding 600 ft lbs. it will be up to the shooter to provide a chronograph print out if proof is required.

15- Common Calibers permitted are as follows.

.22 short and .22LR, (hollow points are permitted for rim fire)

“NO” .17HMR

9 MM .40 S&W .45ACP .38 Special .357 Magnum, .44 Special, .45 LC 7.62x25 will be permitted as long as it's not surplus steel core ammunition

16- If there are a large number of shooters using the range, a time limit may be imposed at the discretion of the range officer.

17- Keep your finger off the trigger when raising and lowering the firearm to or from your shooting position. This is to avoid accidentally shooting anything other than the target. Contact the trigger only when your firearm is pointing at the target.

18- All uncased revolvers must have the cylinder open and unloaded, all single action revolvers that use a loading gate with a non-opening cylinder must use an Empty Chamber Indicator, All semi-automatics must have the slide locked open and the magazine removed. This rule should be followed when showing the firearm.

SSWA RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR AWARDS

1. Must be a current member of the SSWA prior to the catch or harvest of his or her trophy.
2. All trophies entered must be taken within Saskatchewan in the current year. Fish caught in border lakes that recognize a Saskatchewan Licence also count as caught within Sask.
3. It is the responsibility of the owner, to enter their trophy to the SSWA's Awards Committee.
4. All fish and game birds require the signature of a witness and must be weighed on a digital scale. Or a photo evidence of the fish or game bird with the weight registered\showing on the scale is acceptable. The same photo evidence is required for catch and release situations.
5. Big game animals must be scored by Boone & Crockett, Henry Kelsey and Pope & Young standards by an individual certified to conduct the measurements.
6. All entries must be submitted by January 15th of the following year and are only eligible for the calendar year in which they were taken. Send your entries to mikecoupland@sasktel.net Trophy Chair SSWA.
7. Application forms for awards are available online at the SSWA website southsaskwildlife@gmail.com, or from any director of the SSWA.
8. Any dispute will be resolved by the SSWA directorate.
9. Award Categories will include:
 - ● BEST BIG GAME ANIMAL TAKEN WITH A RIFLE (Rifle Trophy)
 - ● BEST BIG GAME ANIMAL TAKEN WITH A MUSKET (Black Powder), (Best Big Game scores are calculated by the Henry Kelsey minimum score divided into the actual score, multiplied by 100 = percentage.
 - eg. $(165/173 \times 100 = 104.84\%)$
 - ● JR HUNTERS 16 AND UNDER
 - ● JR CHAMPION ANGLER: One Fish Best Weight (Must be 12 years of age or under when fish is caught.)
 - ● NOVICE CHAMPION ANGLER: One Fish Best Weight (Must be 13-16 years of age when fish is caught.)

Jr and Novice trophies will be calculated by the SSWA Minimum Qualifying Weight divided into the actual weight, multiplied by 100 = percentage. eg. (Walleye 2.7kg divided by 1.6kg=168% or in imperial weights 5.9lb divided by 3.5=168%).

SSWA MINIMUM QUALIFYING WEIGHTS:

Walleye 1.6kg 3.5lb; Pike 2.9kg 6.4lb; Perch 0.29kg 0.65.b; White Fish 1.13kg 2.5lb; Rainbow 1.13kg 2.5lb; Brook 0.45kg 1.0lb; Lakers 2.6kg 5.7lb; LmBass 1.09kg 2.4lb.

- ● ADULT CHAMPION ANGLER 17 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER:
